At that meeting, in my annual report, I included the following reminder of our purpose which I wish to share with you: *His Mother said to the servants:* **"Do whatever He tells you."** (John 2:5) We are dedicated to serving Mary, our Mother Thrice Admirable, Queen of our Hearts, as pilgrims and board members, by promoting the growth of the Schoenstatt Movement through spiritual formation and family oriented activities at the parishes in this area. Our ardent desire is to build a Daughter Shrine (Mother of the Eucharist) on our land in Delphi, Indiana with an adjacent Retreat Center where such activities will have their true home. In these next few years, a very important focus of our endeavors will be to prepare, locally, for the Centennial Celebration of the founding of Schoenstatt that will take place in October 2014.

In keeping with this primary purpose of ours, many of you already know that on August 15th, we honored Our Mother Thrice Admirable in a special way with a Mass on the Feast of her Assumption celebrated by Schoenstatt Father Joy Puthussery. Around sixty of you gathered at her Wayside Shrine in Delphi. Father Joy himself had to make a round trip of seven hours in one day for this gathering. What a sacrifice! We were especially pleased to see the little children present. **Childlikeness** is what we strive for in our Schoenstatt movement. Also, Father Joy reminded us in his thoughtful homily that another **key element of our spirituality is placing ourselves daily at our Blessed Mother's service, as her instruments.** As we continuously repeat: "Nothing without you, nothing without us." We thank Joann Clark for being our music leader on this occasion. Everyone sang from the heart both before and after our Rosary and during Holy Mass. Many thanks to each and everyone one for all your help!

On July 22, I had the privilege of being at Mount Schoenstatt in Mulgoa, New South Wales, Australia. This Shrine is about an hour away from Sydney. It was a cool and misty day. I was struck by the surrounding spaciousness, the simplicity and the serenity of this Daughter Shrine. What a blessing it was to walk into the Shrine and to see the dear, familiar elements. To pray before Jesus in the Tabernacle. To feel at home; one of the special graces of Schoenstatt.

Now, we are back home in Indiana--home with our home shrines, home at the Wayside Shrine in Delphi where our Lady has planted herself. We pray for donations, large or small, so that on this site we too may build her a Daughter Shrine. Mary dwells in her chosen shrines with extraordinary graces. But it is up to us to offer our strivings and sacrifices to her Capital of Grace.



As I already mentioned, in 2014, we will mark the 100th Anniversary of the founding of the Schoenstatt Movement by Father Joseph Kentenich.

That explains why she so often has no rest until the sanctuary lamp may be lit in her shrines and the "silent prisoner of the Tabernacle" has taken up His abode there. It also explains why all those who surrender themselves to her are--as if caught up in a whirlpool--swept to Christ and with and in Him in the Holy Spirit to God the Father...

Wherever the Mother Thrice Admirable and Queen of Schoenstatt settles, she is primarily and particularly active, as is her wont, as educator in our modern times. Her shrines are the formation centers and workshops of the new man and the new social order in the way that God desires for today, so that the Church can perfectly fulfill her mission for our times... All who dedicate themselves to her there, all who make a covenant of love with her will be taken by her into a serious school of genuine, solid everyday sanctity such as our times need.
